Mar 27-Mar 30 **Introduction to Machine Sewing**—Ella Humetewa & Donna Kaye. 6pm-9pm, Hopitutuqaiki, Kykotsmovi.

M-Th This class is meant for beginners who have never sewn before or for those beginners who would like a review of basic sewing lessons. Fabric care, fabric selection, use of tools and supplies and how to use a basic sewing machine will be taught. Participants will make a pillow or a placemat for their first project. Participants are asked to bring their own machines to get familiar with them, or the school can provide one upon request. Class size is limited to 8 students, 14 to adult. Tuition: \$48.

Apr 24-Apr 27 **Fabric Crafts**—Lorrie Petersen & Donna Kaye. 6pm-9pm, Hopitutuqaiki, Kykotsmovi.

M-Th Make one or more items: a zippered pouch, a bowl, placemats and/or a picture frame out of fabric. The class will include an opportunity to learn free-motion quilting. Because all machines are different it is suggested that participants use their own machine, however the school can loan out a machine upon request. Class is limited to 6 students, 14 to adult. Tuition: \$60.

Apr 24-Apr 27 **Fabric Crafts**—Lorrie Petersen & Donna Kaye. 9am-1pm, Hopitutuqaiki, Kykotsmovi.

M-Th Make one or more items: a zippered pouch, a bowl, placemats and/or a picture frame out of fabric. The class will include an opportunity to learn free-motion quilting. Because all machines are different it is suggested that participants use their own machine, however the school can loan out a machine upon request. Class is limited to 6 students, 14 to adult. Tuition: \$60.

May 22-May 25 **Sewing—Shirt/Vest**—Ella Humetewa & Donna Kaye. 10am-3pm. Hopitutuqaiki, Kykotsmovi.

M-Th Using a basic pattern design a shirt or a vest using native print fabric. Because all machines are different it is suggested that participants use their own machine, however the school can loan out a machine upon request. Class is limited to 8 students, 14 to adult. General sewing knowledge is encouraged. Tuition: \$60.

June 5-June 30 **Hopi Kilts**—Austin Lomatewama, 8am to noon, Bacavi Warehouse.

M-F Learn to weave Hopi kilt (pitkuna). The use of looms, tools and strings is included with paid tuition. Class is limited to 3 Hopi initiated students, 14 years old to adult. The techniques learned in this class will be used in other weaving classes. Tuition: \$240.

June 5-June 30 **Embroidery (for Pitkuna)**—Lorencita Saufkie, 6pm-9pm, Hopitutuqaiki, Kykotsmovi

M-F Learn to do the embroidery for the pitkuna. Bring your own blank pitkuna weaving if you have one. If not, monk's cloth will be provided. This embroidery can also apply to a vest or skirt. The use of tools and yarns is included with paid tuition. Class size is limited to 6 students, 18 years old to adult. Tuition: \$240.

June 5-June 30 **Hopi Language Preschool**—Jolene Lomayaktewa, 9am-1pm, Kykotsmovi Headstart Center.

Is Hopi language important to you and your family? Give your child a start in Hopi language. Preschool activities in Hopi language and the arts. including local field trips and lunches. Class size is limited to 8 students, 3 and 4 years old, must be toilet trained. Parent assistance will be scheduled. Tuition: \$100.

June 5-June 16 **Oil Painting**—Anthony Honahnie, 8am-noon, Hopitutuqaiki, Kykotsmovi

M-F Learn techniques of oil painting and layering on canvas, wood (dolls, boxes) or paper. Will include design elements and detail. Canvas, paper, brushes and paints will be supplied. Class is limited to 6 students, 14 years to adult. Tuition: \$120

June 5-June 16 **Moccasins**—Lewis Abeita—6pm-9pm, Hopitutuqaiki, Kykotsmovi.

Learn to make moccasins Pueblo style and Hopi style. Use of all materials and tools is included with paid tuition. Class is limited to 4 Hopi initiated students. Tuition: \$120.

June 5-June 9 **Photography**—Sam Minkler, 8am-4pm, Flagstaff.

M-F This is an advanced photography class dealing with digital cameras and using PhotoShop and other computer programs to manipulate photos. Much of the class will take place in Flagstaff. There will also be field trips and studio photography. Class size is limited to 6 students, 14 years to adult. Bring your own digital camera. Tuition: \$120.

June 12-June 16 **Hopi Foods**—Iva Honyestewa, 8am-noon, Iskasokpu Gallery, Second Mesa.

M-F From corn to many different kinds of food. Students will have hands-on experience in all aspects of making Hopi food. The class will prepare the ingredients, cook, and get to eat the products. Class size is limited to 6 students, 8 years old to adult. Tuition: \$60.

June 12-June 28 **Beginning Hopi Wicker Plaques**—Harriet Lomatska, 8am-noon, Loloma Studio (HWY 264 MP 368.2).

M-F Learn the techniques to make a yungyapu from start to finish, collect and prepare materials, learn terminology. Materials and tools are provided with paid tuition. If students can get sticks, bring them. Two additional days will be scheduled in September to collect and prepare sticks. Class size is limited to 6 students, Jr. High to adult, initiated at Third Mesa. Tuition: \$180.

June 19-June 30 **Sifter Basket Weaving**—Stephanie Kayquoptewa, 8am-noon (8-4 on some days to gather materials), Hotevilla

M-F Glassworks, Hotevilla (HWY 264, MP 368). This class will be a hands-on experience for making sifter baskets. Gather and prepare materials, tools, techniques. Use of tools is included with paid tuition. There will be a field trip to Museum of Northern Arizona to look at baskets in their archives. Class size is limited to 6 Hopi initiated students. Tuition: \$108.

June 19-June 30 **Stained Glass**— Ramson Lomatewama, 8am-noon, Sonwai Studio, Hotevilla (HWY 264 MP 368.2).

M-F Learn to cut and construct with colored glass to make stained glass windows and hangings. The use of tools and materials is included with paid tuition. Class is limited to 4 students, 14 years to adult. Tuition: \$120.

June 19-June 23 **Zuni Dress**—Eileen Navakuku 6pm-9pm, Hopitutuqaiki, Kykotsmovi.

M-F Learn to make a Zuni dress traditional wear. Because all machines are different it is suggested that participants use their own machine, however the school can loan out a machine upon request. Class is limited to 6 students, 14 to adult. Tuition: \$60.

June 26-June 29 **Sewing—Dress Making**—Ella Humetewa & Donna Kaye, 10am-3pm, Hopitutuqaiki, Kykotsmovi.

M-Th Using a basic pattern, design a dress using native print fabric. Participants will learn to adjust a pattern to size. Because all machines are different it is suggested that participants use their own machine, however the school can loan out a machine upon request. Class is limited to 8 students, 14 to adult. General sewing knowledge is encouraged. Tuition: \$60.

July 5-July 21 **Mutsapnguenkwewa (Dance Sash)**—Akema Honyumptewa, 7:30am-Noon, Bacavi Warehouse.

M-F Learn to weave Mutsapnguenkwewa. Students should be able to complete at least one side during the class. Looms, yarns and tools will be provided. Class is limited to 5 students, must be initiated and must know how to make kilts or belts or both. Tuition: \$180.

July 6-July 7 **Introduction to Free Motion Quilting**—Linda Visnaw & Mary Duwyenie—9am-4pm, Hopitutuqaiki, Kykotsmovi

Th-F The class will introduce techniques for free motion sewing with machines. Because all machines are different it is suggested that participants use their own machine, however the school can loan out a machine upon request. Class is limited to 8 students, 14 to adult. General sewing knowledge is encouraged. Tuition: \$60.

July 10-July 21 **Art for Kids**—Karen Knorowski, 8am-noon, Loloma Studio (HWY 264 MP 368.2).

M-F The class uses various art techniques for children, using local materials and ideas. Students will work with clay and keep an art journal. Students will learn how to make a tile mosaic on fiberglass mesh that will be applied to a bridge in Flagstaff. Materials are included with paid tuition. Class size is limited to 6 students, 3rd grade to 6th grade. Tuition: \$120.

July 10-July 16 **Opportunity Quilt**—Linda Visnaw & Mary Duwyenie—9am-4pm, Hopitutuqaiki, Kykotsmovi.

M-F Classroom. **A quilting party!** Working together to make a quilt that will be raffled to raise money for Hopitutuqaiki, going to several quilt shows in the region. Use of machines, tools and material is included with registration. Bring your own machine if you prefer. This will be an old-fashioned quilting party! Class size is limited to 7 students, 14 years old to adult with previous quilting experience. No Tuition.

July 24-July 28 **Special Projects in the Arts**—James McGrath, 8am-noon, Loloma Studio (HWY 264 MP 368.2)

M-F Study with a Living Treasure of Santa Fe. Bring ideas for any project in painting, writing, clay, teaching, mixed media, book making, dance or other area. Materials and tools are included with paid tuition. Class size is limited to 7 students, Jr. High School to adult. Tuition: \$60.

Aug 28-Aug 31 **Quilt Making**—Ella Humetewa & Donna Kaye. 10am-3pm, Hopitutuqaiki, Kykotsmovi.

M-Th Modern quilt making techniques will be taught such as: fabric selection and care, using a rotary cutter to prepare your fabric, machine quilting versus tying and binding. Participants are expected to complete a baby quilt. Participants are asked to use their own machines in order to become more familiar with them, however the school can loan out a machine upon request. Class is limited to 8 students, 14 to adult. General sewing knowledge is encouraged. Tuition: \$60.

Oct 16-Oct 27 **Glass Blowing**—Ramson Lomatewama, 8am-noon, Hotevilla Glassworks, Hotevilla (HWY 264 MP 368).

M-F Learn to use melted glass to make paper weights, flowers, mushrooms and more. All materials are included with paid tuition. Class size is limited to 3 students, 14 years and older. Tuition: \$120.
